Your spirit is what God sees and relates to – the real you.

- It was your spirit that died and was separated from God through the sin of Adam. Our main disease is a spiritual one.
- John 4:24 "God [is] Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."
- Joh 3:6 "That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.
- 1Co 15:50 Now this I say, brethren, that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God; nor does corruption inherit incorruption.

Your spirit as a Christian is sealed.

- 2Co 1:22 who also has sealed us and given us the Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee.
- Eph 1:13 In Him you also [trusted], after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in whom also, having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise,
- Eph 4:30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

Your spirit as a Christian is perfect.

Heb 10:14 (NIV) - because by one sacrifice he has made <u>perfect forever</u> those who are being made holy.

2Co 5:17 Therefore, if anyone [is] in Christ, [he is] a <u>new creation</u>; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

Eph 4:24 and that you put on the <u>new man</u> which was created according to God, in true righteousness and holiness.

2Co 5:21 For He made Him who knew no sin [to be] sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

Ro 8:1 ¶ [There is] therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus ...

1Co 6:17 But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit [with Him].

1Jo 4:17 ¶ Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have <u>boldness in the day of</u> judgment; because as He is, so are we in this world.

Isa 53:5 But He [was] wounded for our transgressions, [He was] bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace [was] upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed.

Isa 54:8 With a little wrath I hid My face from you for a moment; But with everlasting kindness I will have mercy on you," Says the LORD, your Redeemer.

Isa 54:9 "For this [is] like the waters of Noah to Me; For as I have sworn That the waters of Noah would no longer cover the earth, So have I sworn That I would not be angry with you, nor rebuke you.

Isa 54:10 For the mountains shall depart And the hills be removed, But My kindness shall not depart from you, Nor shall My covenant of peace be removed," Says the LORD, who has mercy on you.

Joh 3:18 "He who believes in Him is <u>not condemned</u>; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

Joh 5:24 "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life.

HEBREWS VERSES:-

Heb 9:12 Not with the blood of goats and calves, but with His own blood He entered the Most Holy Place once for all, having obtained <u>eternal redemption</u>. What does it mean for you that Jesus obtained eternal redemption?

Heb 9:13 For if the blood of bulls and goats and the ashes of a heifer, sprinkling the unclean, sanctifies for the purifying of the flesh,

Heb 9:14 how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the <u>eternal Spirit</u> offered Himself without spot to God, cleanse your <u>conscience</u> from dead works to serve the living God? How is your conscience? This truth should be used by you to cleanse your conscience. Imagine the Israelites at the Passover. They had to calm their fears / conscience by trusting the blood of the lamb.

Heb 9:25 not that He should offer Himself often, as the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year with blood of another--

Heb 9:26 He then would have had to suffer often since the foundation of the world; but now, once at the end of the ages, He has appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself.

1Jo 2:2 (NIV) He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for {Or He is the one who turns aside God's wrath, taking away our sins, and not only ours but also} the sins of the whole world. These verses show how extensive His payment for sin is – all time and all people.

Heb 9:28 so Christ was offered <u>once</u> to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait for Him He will appear a second time, <u>apart from sin</u>, for salvation. When he comes again he will not judge sin (since it's already paid for). He only asks did you believe in me or not? Did you accept the blood of the lamb?

Heb 10:1 ¶ For the law, having a shadow of the good things to come, [and] not the very image of the things, can never with these same sacrifices, which they offer continually year by year, make those who approach perfect.

Heb 10:2 For then would they not have ceased to be offered? For the worshipers, once purified, would have had no more consciousness of sins. You should have NO CONSCIOUSNESS OF SIN ANYMORE.

Heb 10:10 By that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ <u>once</u> for all. <u>ONCE FOR ALL</u>.

Heb 10:12 But this Man, after He had offered <u>one sacrifice for sins forever</u>, sat down at the right hand of God, WHY DID HE SIT DOWN?

Heb 10:13 from that time waiting till His enemies are made His footstool.

Heb 10:14 For by one offering He has <u>perfected forever</u> those who are being sanctified. Can you accept this?

Our response...

<u>Heb 10:22</u> let us draw near with a true heart in <u>full assurance</u> of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.
