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What was Paul's message? And how did he communicate it?

- A message of GRACE Acts 13:38, 39, Act 14:3, Act 18:27, Act 20:24, Act 20:32
- God is great, the CREATOR and ultimately the only true God. Acts 14:14-18; Acts 17:22-32; Acts 13:15 41
- The KINGDOM of God is here ie. God should be King but the devil, who usurped this position, has been defeated by Jesus and we His people are now bringing this news rulership to you. Healing and deliverance are a key part of this. Act 14:22; Act 13:9-12; Act 19:8; Act 20:25
- We have all sinned and therefore we must all REPENT and receive this free gift to avoid judgement one day. Acts 17:30; 20:21
- When we receive this we can receive the gift of the HOLY SPIRIT and complete forgiveness and power. Acts 13:52; Acts 19:2
- It included a message that the hearers should also spread this message to THE WORLD. Acts 13:49; Acts 19:10

- When Paul was speaking to Jews he used Old Testament verses to prove these points. Acts 13:15 41
- When he was talking to non Jews he used nature, logic and even their own poems, beliefs and literature to make the same points. Acts 14:14-18; Acts 17:22-32

- WHO Who does the ministry, how do teams work, who are the elders and the church government positions. Can I be like one of the people described in these stories?
- WHAT What did they do on a daily / weekly / long term basis? What is the church supposed to be doing? What doctrines and emphases did they have? Can I emulate this today?
- WHERE Where did they met? Where did they travel? How does this apply to me and us today?

- HOW The methods of church planting and growth. How were they supported financially? How were they guided by God? How did they go about doing what they did? Can we emulate this today?
- WHY The motivation the purpose and mission behind everything they did.
- WHEN when did church meetings occur? How did they get guidance on when to do something for the Lord or when to wait?
