SERMON NOTES - Christmas 2022 - O little town of Bethlehem

<u>Luke 2:1-7</u> NKJV - 1 And it came to pass in those days [that] a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2 This census first took place while Quirinius was governing Syria. 3 So all went to be registered, everyone to his own city. 4 Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, 5 to be registered with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was with child. 6 So it was, that while they were there, the days were completed for her to be delivered. 7 And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

Zechariah 4:10 NIV - "10 "Who dares despise the day of small things, since the seven eyes of the LORD that range throughout the earth will rejoice when they see the chosen capstone in the hand of Zerubbabel?""

1. What is / was Bethlehem like?

W. F. Albright, an American archaeologist, estimated the population of Bethlehem to have been about 300 when Jesus was born.

Bethlehem is mentioned in the Bible at least twenty different times and in eleven different books in the Old and New Testaments.

Genesis 35:19 NKJV - "19 So **Rachel** died and was buried on the way to Ephrath (that is, Bethlehem)."

Ruth 4:11 NKJV - "11 And all the people who were at the gate, and the elders, said, "We are witnesses. The LORD make the woman who is coming to your house like Rachel and Leah, the two who built the house of Israel; and may you prosper in Ephrathah and be famous in Bethlehem." 1 Samuel 17:15 NKJV - "15 But David occasionally went and returned from Saul to feed his father's sheep at Bethlehem."

<u>2 Samuel 23:15-16</u> NKJV - "15 And David said with longing, "Oh, that someone would give me a drink of the water from the well of Bethlehem, which is by the gate!" 16 So the three mighty men broke through the camp of the Philistines, drew water from the well of Bethlehem that was by the gate, and took it and brought it to David. Nevertheless he would not drink it, but poured it out to the LORD."

2. God's plan was for Messiah to be born in Bethlehem.

Prophecies - <u>Micah 5:2</u> NKJV - "2 "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, Though you are little among the thousands of Judah, Yet out of you shall come forth to Me The One to be Ruler in Israel, Whose goings forth are from of old, From everlasting.""

Amazing power of prophecies - J. Barton Payne, has found as many as 574 verses in the Old Testament that somehow point to or describe or reference the coming Messiah. Alfred Edersheim found 456 Old Testament verses referring to the Messiah or His times. Conservatively, Jesus fulfilled at least 300 prophecies in His earthly ministry.

Peter W. Stoner and Robert C. Newman wrote a book entitled <u>Science Speaks</u>. The book was based on the science of probability and vouched for by the American Scientific Affiliation. It set out the odds of any one man in all of history fulfilling even only eight of the prophecies fulfilled by the life of Christ.

The probability that Jesus of Nazareth could have fulfilled even eight such prophecies would be only one in 10^{A17} . That's 1 with 17 zeros after it.

Stoner claims that that many silver dollars would be enough to cover the face of the entire state of Texas two feet deep. The chances that he would be able, on his very first attempt, to pick up one specifically marked silver dollar is 1 out of $10^{^{17}}$.

 - Ask each person to pray or you, as leader, pray for each person's need
